MISSION

Develop a long-term data storage strategy for the university

- Full lifecycle of the university's administrative, teaching, outreach, and research data
- Strategies for online storage and offline/archival storage
- Consistent with applicable regulations and university policies on data security and retention



GOALS

Clearly defined roles and responsibilities for central IT, distributed IT, and other key stakeholders to ensure that university data is

- Stored using the most appropriate mechanism given the use case
- Protected against corruption or loss
- Managed throughout the appropriate lifecycle of the data
- Retained for a period that is consistent with applicable law and/or policy



DELIVERABLES

- Report describing the university's current data storage needs and capacity and a short-term forecast (2-5 years) of future storage needs.
- A taxonomy of storage use cases capable of addressing needs in all aspects of the university mission
 - To include prescriptive advice on mechanisms for data storage and data loss prevention for each use case
- Recommendations on funding models, particularly for common data storage needs of most/all university units.
